Summary of key public matters considered by the Committee:

This report provides a summary of the key issues considered at the Quality Committee meeting on 28 April 2022 (involving Ms V Bailey, Quality Committee Non-Executive Director Chair; Professor T Robinson, Non-Executive Director; Mr J Worrall, Associate Non-Executive Director; Ms G Collins-Punter, Associate Non-Executive Director; Dr G Sharma, Associate Non-Director; Mr A Furlong, Medical Director; Ms N Green, Deputy Chief Nurse; Mr J Melbourne, Chief Operating Officer; Miss M Durbridge, Director of Quality, Transformation and Efficiency Improvement; and Ms H Hutchinson, Leicester City CCG. (Ms Claire Rudkin Head of Patient Safety; Mr Lisa Lane, Head of Nursing; Ms Penny McParland, Consultant Obstetrician;, Ms Caroline Whiteley, Deputy Service Manager/HTA Designated Lead; Ms Judy Gilmore, Head of Operations; Ms Janice Brown, Deputy Lead Cancer Nurse; Mr Simon Pizzey Head of Strategy and Planning; Dr Stella Salta Haematologist Consultant; Ms Colette Marshall, Deputy Medical Director attended to present their respective items).

CQC Statement of Purpose – The Committee noted that the Trust was required to notify the Care Quality
Commission of any changes to its services or registered locations. The changes with respect to the National Centre
for Sports and Exercise Medicine and Renal Care were noted.
 The report was recommended to the Board for approval.

Resolved items

- Pertinent Safety Issues the Deputy Chief Nurse, the Medical Director and the Chief Operating Officer briefed
 the Committee on the following pertinent safety issues:- changes to Infection Prevention Controls; move of
 services to accommodate the interim reconfiguration of ITU; pressures on the Emergency Department, CQC visit.
- Patient Safety Report The Committee considered the monthly patient safety report noting that 12 Serious Incidents had been escalated in March 2022 and that two were Never Events. A summary of the two new Never Events and the main point of learning from the closed Never Event investigation were reported. A total of nine Never Events had been escalated in 2021/22 which was the highest annual number recorded for the Trust. A separate report detailing the Never Event Action Plan was considered at the meeting. This discussion is highlighted to the Trust Board for information.
- External Guidance Quarter 1-3 NICE report The Committee received a report noting the Trust's compliance
 with guidance issued by the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE). The report referenced two
 outstanding responses which had subsequently been received. The Committee was assured of the Trust's
 compliance. This discussion is highlighted to the Trust Board for information.
- Mortuary procedures The Committee received a report which set out the actions taken in respect of audit
 undertaken in summer 2021 which found there had been errors in accounting for products of conception. Work had
 been undertaken to review processes and improve communication between the Pathology Department and
 Obstetrics and Gynaecology. It was noted that the establishment of Bereavement Midwives had increased which
 had a positive impact on process and patient care.
- Mortuary Security Close Down Report The Committee received a report on the actions taken to ensure
 compliance with a national directive regarding security for the mortuary. The Committee was assured that all the
 actions, including the outstanding one noted on the report, had been taken and confirmation provided to NHS

Estates. This discussion is highlighted to the Trust Board for information.

- Cancer Harm Quarter 3 Report The Committee received an update to the Cancer Harm 2022/23 Quarter 3 report which provided more information in relation to a case of patient harm referenced in the original report. Whilst there had been a delay in treating the patient, the review found that it would have been very unlikely to have changed the eventual outcome.
- Outpatient Transformation The Committee received a report on the transformation of outpatient services focussing on the feedback received from patients. It was noted that as part of the NHS Long-term Plan that the ambition was to offer more virtual appointments and reduce the number of follow up appointments. It was noted there had been no deterioration in the scores the Friends and Family Test with the exception of one aspect of the service. When patients were offered a face to face appointment, which was subsequently changed to a virtual appointment, the satisfaction score was lower. The discussion noted the need to address the rate of 'Do Not Attend' for appointments and the pilot to offer additional support to patients.
- Thrombosis Committee report The Committee received a performance report Venous thromboembolism (VTE) prevention and treatment strategy and governance. The positive performance in Q1-3 21/22 against the Quality Schedule for VTE was noted. The report highlighted key workstreams for to support the strategic direction.
- Safe Surgery and Never Event Action Plan The Committee received a report on the Safe Surgery workstream in UHL's Quality Strategy. It incorporated an update of the Never Event Action Plan and updates from the Consent and Patient Information Committees. Positive progress was noted specifically in relation to improved reporting; launch of the theatre practitioner competency and leadership programme; and trust-wide roll-out of Trauma Risk Management Methodology (TRiM) training. The Local Safety Standards for Invasive Procedure (LocSSIP) accreditation and assurance programme would be restarted. The Trust would be joining a Never Event Collaborative with Imperial College Healthcare, Barts Health, and Royal United Hospitals Bath trusts to share best practice.



Aims and objectives

What are your aims and objectives in providing the regulated activities and locations shown in part 3 of this statement of purpose

We are one of the biggest and busiest NHS Trusts in the country, serving the one million residents of Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland – and increasingly specialist services over a much wider area. Our nationally and internationally-renowned specialist treatment and services in cardio-respiratory diseases, ECMO, cancer and renal disorders reach a further two to three million patients from the rest of the country.

Spread over the General, Glenfield and Royal Infirmary hospitals, we also have our very own Children's Hospital and work closely with partners at the University of Leicester and De Montfort University providing world-class teaching to nurture and develop the next generation of doctors, nurses and other healthcare professionals, many of whom go on to spend their working lives with us.

We continue to work with many different organisations throughout the world to push the boundaries of research and new surgical procedures for the benefit of our patients, with around 1,000 clinical trials taking place every year. We are now home to an NIHR Biomedical Research Centre which supports key research including lifestyle, diabetes, and cardio-respiratory diseases,

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and for the first time we have been successfully designated as an NIHR Clinical Research Facility. We are also extremely proud that we have an Experimental Cancer Medicine Centre and our HOPE Unit is an instrumental factor in delivering clinical trials of new cancer treatments, and is generously supported by the locally-based charity Hope Against Cancer. We are providing access to cutting edge genetic medicine for our patients by participating in the 100,000 Genomes Project. All of this means that thousands of our patients are amongst the first to try the latest medicines and techniques.

Our heart centre at the Glenfield hospital continues to lead the way in developing new and innovative research and techniques, such as surgery with a Robotic Arm, TAVI (Trans-Catheter Aortic Valve Insertion) and the use of the suture less valve in heart surgery. It has also become one of the world's busiest ECMO (extra corporeal membrane oxygenation) centres and the only hospital in the UK to provide ECMO therapy for both adults and children.

We have one of the best vascular services nationally, with more patients surviving longer after following an aneurysm repair (to fix a life threatening bulge in a blood vessel). And we are proud to continue to have some of the lowest rates of hospital-acquired infections, such as C.Difficile and MRSA, in the country.




